Mission Statement:

To aid as well as support the rehabilitation of current substance abusers into developing new and healthier ways of coping with life.

Goals for 2013:

• To increase the number of clients served by ERC's substance abuse

treatment program

- To raise more money to fund operations at ERC
- To host two youth prevention events through BHS/COPE
- To maintain program license's from the PA Division of Drug and Alcohol Programs
- To be approved to accept reimbursement from major insurance companies

Accomplishments in 2013:

- ERC's license from the State of Pennsylvania to provide outpatient substance abuse treatment was renewed on June 30, 2013.
- ERC increased the number of clients treated through contracts with Guadenzia/ Community Education Center and referrals from DERP.

• ERC moved to a larger office to accommodate the growing number of clients.

• ERC's application to be an approved outpatient substance abuse treatment provider for Medicare was accepted.

• ERC hosted two substance abuse prevention activities for youth through funds from Holcomb Behavioral Health Services Committee On Prevention Education.

Finance:

A total of \$ 40,334.12 was accepted by ERC in 2013. Some of this support came from donations from Seeds of Greatness Ministry, Covenant Heritage Bible Church and St. Mary Magdalene Community. The majority of this money came from payment for treatment provided to clients.

A total of \$150 was collected in board member dues.

Funds were spent in the following ways: Rent for office space, insurance, furniture, phone and internet services, office supplies, and salaries for the staff.

Operations:

The board of Directors met 6 times in 2013.

- To host two youth prevention events through Holcomb Behavioral Health Services/COPE
- To maintain program license from the PA Division of Drug and Alcohol Programs

- Continue to provide drug and alcohol evaluations for local district

• To utilize volunteer positions for basic clerical assistance
